SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS

Government Sponsored

Federal Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG)— provides up to \$750 for freshman level students and \$1,300 for sophomore level students with a 3.0 G.P.A. seeking an Associates degree. The student must be receiving a Pell Grant, be a U.S. citizen, have completed a rigorous high school program and be attending full-time.

Federal Pell Grant— Provides grants up to \$4,731 per year (pending Federal funding levels.) Full-time, three-quarter time, half-time, and less than half-time awards are based on student need, which is prorated accordingly. (Amount can change yearly.)

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant— Provides grants up to \$4,000 per year to those in exceptional need. Minimum half-time enrollment is required.

U.S. Maritime Administration Student Incentive Payments of \$3,000 per year for four years are available to a select number of qualifying cadets in each entering class at the Great Lakes Maritime Academy. Details on the program are available through the GLMA Department of Naval Science.

Michigan Adult Part-Time Grant— Provides grants up to \$600 per year to adult students who are enrolled for 3-11 credits each semester. Maximum funding is for 24 months. Apply using separate application available in Financial Aid Office.

Michigan Competitive Scholarship— Provides scholarships up to \$1,300 per year based on ACT scores and financial need. This award is tuition/fee restricted.

Michigan Educational Opportunity Grant— Provides grants up to \$1,000 per year to students enrolled on a minimum half-time basis.

Michigan Merit Award Scholarship Program is given to Michigan residents who have qualifying scores through the Michigan Educational Assessment Program (MEAP) High School Test (HST), have graduated from high school or received a GED and have not been convicted of a felony involving an assault, physical injury or death. These grants are up to \$2500. Additional information can be obtained from the Michigan Department of Treasury at 1-888-447-2687. This scholarship discontinued with the high school graduating class of 2006. It is being replaced by the Michigan Promise Scholarship.

Michigan Promise Scholarship— provides up to \$2,000 to Michigan residents starting with the high school graduating class of 2007 who have qualifying scores on the Michigan Merit Exam and apply within two years of graduation. Students must maintain a 2.5 GPA in order to continue to receive this scholarship. Upon completion of an associate's degree, 2-year vocational training program, or 50% or more of the academic requirements for the award of a bachelor's degree at an approved postsecondary educational institution within four years of initial enrollment a student may be eligible for an additional \$2,000 upon submission of application. Additional information can be obtained from the Michigan Department of Treasury at 1-888-447-2687.

Michigan Native American Tuition Waiver may cover tuition for certified North American Indians (1/4 blood) who enroll in a public college or university and are a Michigan resident. Contact your tribal association for additional information.

Michigan Nursing Scholarship— provides up to \$4,000 for Michigan residents enrolled in the Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) or Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) programs. Students must file the FAFSA form and show financial need. Separate applications are available in the Financial Aid Office.

Occupational Programs Grants are awarded to students enrolled in an approved occupational program who demonstrate financial need. It may be used toward the cost of tuition, fees, required books/supplies, transportation and/or daycare.

SGA Child Care Grant— The NMC Student Government Association provides funding to assist with the cost of child care while students are attending class. Apply using separate application available in Financial Aid Office.

Tuition Incentive Program (TIP)— Student eligibility is determined before high school graduation. This program will pay up to 24 semester credits (will not cover contact hours) per academic year of current in-district resident tuition rates up to a maximum of 80 semester credits or upon completion of an Associate degree, whichever comes first. The program will cover registration and health fees up to \$250 per semester. Students must initiate benefits for enrollment within four years of high school graduation or GED completion. For students residing in an area not included in a community college district, the out-of-district tuition rate may be authorized. Contact the Financial Aid Office at (231) 995-1033 for authorization information. Students must be enrolled on at least a half-time basis each semester. Additional funding may extend to the university level after transferring from a community college. Contact your high school counselor for an application.

NMC SCHOLARSHIPS

Many NMC scholarships are awarded by the Financial Aid Office and require no additional application forms. Eligibility for scholarships requiring demonstration of financial need is determined by filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. All students are encouraged to complete and file this application. Scholarships awarded by other procedures are noted, and some require a special application form.

New scholarships are added continuously as contributions are received. Criteria or availability of scholarship funds are subject to change. Scholarship information is available at: www.nmc.edu/financialaid

General Scholarships

NMC Presidential Scholarships are awarded each spring to academically superior seniors from the NMC service area high schools. A 3.75 GPA is required, along with a recommendation from the school's principal or counselor. The number of scholarships and the funding may vary each year.

If a Presidential scholar is eligible for other tuition-restricted awards (i.e. TIP, Michigan Competitive Scholarship, Native American Tuition Waiver, etc.), those awards will be applied first. Presidential scholarship funds may be used for any remaining balance due at NMC for tuition, fees, or required books and supplies. At NMC, Presidential scholars must maintain a 3.25 grade point average as a full-time student (12 or more credits) to remain eligible. Recipients are also required to perform community volunteer service each semester. For applications and more information, contact NMC's Admissions Office.

NMC Divisional Scholarships provide up to \$2,000 per academic year to second-year students. Application and selection are made through each academic area during Spring Semester for an award for the next academic year. If a Divisional scholar is eligible for other tuition-restricted awards (i.e. TIP, Michigan Competitive Scholarship, Native American Tuition Waiver, etc.) those awards will be applied first. Any remaining balance due for tuition and fees or required books and supplies may be covered by the Divisional Scholarship funds. Details of the application process and eligibility requirements are available in each academic area office.

NMC Honors Scholarships are awarded by the Honors Scholarship Committee. Eight scholarships of \$2,000 each are awarded to full-time students (minimum of 12 credit hours) and four scholarships of \$1,000 each are awarded to part-time students (minimum of six credit hours). Candidates must have earned a minimum 20 semester credit hours at NMC with at least a 3.5 grade point average and three credit hours in the Honors Program. NMC Commitment Scholarships are awarded to students from school districts in NMC's service area selected in eighth grade by their principals and counselors. These academically promising students with financial need are encouraged to complete high school and attend NMC with scholarship support. Recipients must commit to satisfactory academic progress, effort and citizenship. Upon high school graduation, students who have met all requirements receive scholarships. In order to receive this scholarship the student must apply for financial aid using the FAFSA. If a Commitment award student is eligible for other gift aid, those awards will be applied first toward the student's tuition and fees. Commitment scholarships are for tuition and fees only.

Adopt-a-Student Grants are awarded to students enrolled for six or more credit hours who are residents of Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, Leelanau, or Wexford County. The amounts of the grants vary. Adopt-a-Student Grants are awarded based on financial need and require a cumulative minimum 2.5 grade point average. If a recipient is eligible for other restricted awards (TIP, Michigan Competitive Scholarship, Native American Tuition Waiver, etc.), those awards will be applied first. Scholarship funds may be used for remaining tuition, fees, required books and supplies.

AMICAE Scholarship— A \$500 award to a female student taking 1 or more credit hours who qualifies for financial aid.



Amical Scholarship— several \$1,000 scholarships are available fall and spring semester for full or part-time NMC students. Preferred recipients will be employees of La Cuisine Amical or another downtown Traverse City business who also reside within the City of Traverse City. A 2.5 grade point average is required.

Elks Lodge B. P. O. E. #323 Scholarship— awards of approximately \$600 to students from Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska or Leelanau County.

Vivian J. Hedden Bassett Scholarship— two \$750 awards for part- or full-time students from the service area who have at least a 2.5 grade point average. Financial need will be considered if applicants are equally qualified. First consideration will be given to members of the United Methodist Church of Traverse City.

James J. and Dorothy A. Beckett Scholarship— two to three \$500 awards to students from Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, Leelanau, or Wexford County who have at least a 2.0 grade point average and are enrolled for six or more credit hours per semester.

Julius and Barbara Beers Scholarship— an award of approximately \$500 to an Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Leelanau or Kalkaska County resident.

Chuck and Barbara Benson Scholarship— criteria to be determined.

Benzie Area Women's History Project Award— \$500 award for a female part- or full-time student with a 2.5 grade point average. Preference will be given to a Benzie County resident or to a non-traditional student. Recipients must demonstrate financial need.

Bridge Program Circle of Women Givers Scholarship— an award of varied amount will be given to a female enrolled in the Bridge Program with a minimum of 9 credits and a 3.5 grade point average. Students must complete a FAFSA and scholarship application, available from NMC Bridge.

Kalee Bruce Memorial Scholarship— two \$500 awards for students from the service area who are enrolled at least half time. Financial need will be considered if applicants are equally qualified.

Byl Family Scholarship— this \$1,000 award will be given to a full-time student from Grand Traverse County with a 3.0 minimum grade point average and demonstrated financial need.

Clancy Memorial Family Scholarship— criteria to be determined.

The Colligan Scholarship— a \$500 award for a full- or part-time student who has at least a 2.0 grade point average and demonstrates financial need.

George C. Comden Alumni Scholarship— two awards of approximately \$750 each for students from Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Leelanau, Kalkaska, or Wexford County who are enrolled for a minimum of six credit hours. One scholarship may be awarded to a student in a transfer program and one to a student in a degree or certificate career program.

Cone Drive-Extron Scholarship— one award of \$500 or more will be given to a resident of the six-county service area attending NMC as a full or part-time student. A 2.5 grade point average is required and financial need will be considered for equally qualified candidates.

Barbara Cox Scholarship— a \$500 award to a full or part-time student residing in the 6-county service area with a minimum of 2.0 grade point average.

William J. Cunningham Memorial Scholarship— varying awards for part- or full-time students who will be selected by a committee from the Women's Resource Center and NMC's Financial Aid office. Recipients must demonstrate financial need. A minimum 2.5 NMC grade point average is required after the student's first semester to maintain eligibility.

Daisy Chain Scholarship— a \$600 award to a female student from Grand Traverse, Leelanau, Antrim, Benzie, or Kalkaska County.

Edgar and Etta Derbyshire Memorial Scholarship— an award of varying amount for a graduating Manton High School student. A scholarship committee from Manton High School selects the recipient.

Jim DeWitt Scholarship— a \$500 award to a student who has worked with the NMC Building and Grounds staff and has at least a 2.0 grade point average. Contact the Facilities department for additional information.

Lyle DeYoung/Optimist Club Scholarship— a \$1,000 award to a full- or part-time NMC student who resides in the NMC service area, maintains a 3.0 grade point average, and actively participates in community service activities.

Sandra & Gary Drew Scholarship— one \$500 award for a graduating senior from Suttons Bay High School. A committee from the high school will select the recipient each spring.

Monon Dunn Scholarship— one \$500 award made to students residing in Grand Traverse County or the service area who have a 2.5 grade point average, are enrolled for six or more credit hours, and demonstrate financial need.

The Elk Rapids Rotary Club Scholarship— two \$1,000 scholarships for graduates of Elk Rapids High School who are selected by the Elk Rapids Rotary Club.

Richard Bracken Engstrom Scholarship— two \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded annually, with preference given to employees of the Grand Traverse Area Community Living Management Corporation through an application process.

Exchange Club of Traverse City Scholarship— an award of \$500 or more to a student taking 6 or more credits in any field of study at NMC. Additional requirements: a 3.0 grade point average, residency in the NMC six-county service area, and demonstration of financial need.

Fivenson Memorial Scholarship— two scholarships of approximately \$300 each to be awarded to students enrolled for one or more classes.

Glen Lake Woman's Club— Several scholarships available to those graduating from Glen Lake and Leelanau Schools who will be attending NMC. Contact the Glen Lake Woman's Club for information and applications.

Cortland K. Gore Memorial Scholarship— one \$500 award for a Grand Traverse County resident who is registered for 6 or more credit hours. Recipient must have a 2.5 grade point average and demonstrate financial need.

Graceland Fruit Inc. Scholarship— two \$500 awards for fall and spring semesters for part- or full-time residents of Benzie, Manistee, Grand Traverse or Leelanau Counties. Recipients must be employees or family members of employees of Graceland Fruit, Inc. Financial need will be considered for equally qualified applicants. No minimum grade point average is required for new students. Applications are available from Graceland Fruit Inc.'s human resource office.

Griner Family Scholarship— one \$500 award made to students residing in Grand Traverse County or the service area who have at least a 2.5 grade point average and are enrolled for six or more credit hours. Need is considered only if there are equally qualified applicants.

Mickey Grooters Scholarship— one \$500 award for a student enrolled in developmental English or developmental math classes at NMC. Demonstration of financial need is required.

Walter Holland Scholarship— this \$1,000 memorial scholarship will be awarded to a full-time student in any field of study with a 3.0 grade point average. Financial need will be considered for equally qualified candidates.

Home Builders Association of the Grand Traverse Area Home-in-a-Day Association Scholarship— awards from \$500-\$1,500 to students who reside in Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, or Leelanau County and are either an owner, employee, or immediate family member of a current Home Builders Association of the Grand Traverse Area member. Students must have a 2.5 minimum grade point average. Applicants must contact the HBA for an application form.

Bob and Stella Hildorf Scholarship— \$500 will be awarded to a full- or part-time student with a 2.5 grade point average who demonstrates financial need.

Jay and Joan Hook Scholarship— a \$500 award that is given annually to a student graduating from Leland Public High School who will be attending NMC in the following fall semester. The recipient will be selected by faculty and staff at LPHS from those students with a minimum of a 2.5 grade point average. This scholarship may be renewed for a second year at NMC with satisfactory academic progress.

Immanuel Lutheran Church NMC Scholarship— preference for this \$500 scholarship will be given to ILC (Suttons Bay) members attending NMC. Eligible students should have a 2.5 grade point average and be registered for 6 or more credits. Financial need may be considered.

International Student Scholarship— This scholarship is for international students attending NMC who are taking 6 or more credits, have a 2.5 grade point average and are actively involved in the International Student Club at the college. Contact the Admissions office for information and applications.

Lena Christine Jensen Scholarship— varied amounts up to \$1,000 for part-time and up to \$2,000 for full-time students who have at least a 2.5 grade point average, are enrolled for six or more credit hours, and demonstrate financial need.

Student Services

Leslie Lee Scholarship for Elk Rapids High School— the recipient will be selected each spring from graduating seniors of Elk Rapids High School who will be attending NMC the following fall. Preference will be given to those qualifying for financial aid with an educational career goal of completing a four-year college degree.

Arlie Mae [Bedell] Lessard Memorial Scholarship— the \$1,000 award recipient will be a Bellaire High School graduating senior or a returning NMC student who formerly attended Bellaire High. Students have a minimum 2.5 grade point average and will be attending NMC full-time in any field of study the following fall. Recipients will be selected through Bellaire High School each spring. Application required.

Mary Lee Lord Zonta Scholarship— awarded in varying amounts to women who have been assisted by the Women's Resource Center, or other non-profit domestic violence agencies, to supplement education expenses including tuition, fees, books, child care, transportation, and housing. Full or part-time students are eligible. Applicants must complete a FAFSA and a scholarship application, available through Zonta, Women's Resource Center, and NMC.

Malone Antrim County Scholarship— a \$1,000 award to a single mother who is enrolled part- or full-time. Residents of Antrim County will be given preference. Recipients must demonstrate financial need.

Jerry McCarthy Scholarship— numerous awards of varying amount to students in any academic program.

Mutual Service Stations Scholarships— two \$1,000 awards for full- or part-time students in any academic program. A 3.0 grade point average is required and financial need must be demonstrated.

Northern Michigan Chapter API Scholarship— \$1,000 scholarship to a full- or part-time students with 3.0 grade point average and Michigan residency. Contact the Northern Michigan API Chapter in Traverse City for applications.

Northwestern Bank "I can do that!" Scholarship— \$1,000 awarded per year to a full-time student with a minimum 3.0 grade point average in any area of study. Preference will first be given to employees of Northwestern Bank who apply and meet the eligibility requirements. Additional requirements: Must reside in Antrim, Benzie, Charlevoix, Crawford, Emmet, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, Leelanau, Manistee, Mason, Missaukee, Otsego, Roscommon, or Wexford counties. Contact Northwestern Bank or NMC for applications.

NMC Apartment Resident Scholarship— preference for this \$500 scholarship will be given to an NMC student who is actively involved in the NMC Apartment Council. Eligible students must be registered for 6 or more credits and have a grade point average of 2.5.

NMC Faculty Scholarship— \$1,000 will be awarded to a full- or part-time student with a minimum grade point average of 2.0 who also qualifies for financial aid.

NMC 50th Anniversary Scholarship— an award of varying amount will be given to a full-time or part-time student with a 2.5 grade point average who qualifies for financial aid.

NMC Student Government Association Endowment Scholarship— criteria to be determined.

NMC Student Travel Abroad Scholarship— this scholarship will assist an NMC student attending a Michigan Global Awareness Consortium sponsored trip with a \$500 award. Selection will be by an NMC committee.

NMC Support Staff Scholarship— an award of varying amounts (up to \$500 for one academic year) to be awarded by a committee of representatives of the NMC support staff employee group. Recipient must have a minimum 2.0 grade point average, be enrolled for at least 6 credits (half-time), be pursuing a degree or certificate at NMC, and demonstrate financial need. Scholarship will be awarded to someone who may not qualify for other financial aid. Scholarship is for one academic year and will be awarded in two equal portions (fall and spring). Scholarship will be restricted to tuition and related fees, required books and supplies. Application will be made on an annual basis.

Dr. Travis N. & Lucille M. Olson Endowed Scholarship— this \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a Grand Traverse or Leelanau County resident in any academic program. Additional requirements: part-time enrollment status, a 2.5 grade point average, and demonstration of financial need.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship— Two \$500 scholarships are available to those involved in PTK or community service activities. Applicants must have a 3.5 grade point average. Information and applications are available through NMC's Career and Employment Services office or through Phi Theta Kappa.

Allen & Marjorie Pifer Family Scholarship— Criteria to be determined.

William James Potter and Mary Potter Memorial Scholarship— numerous awards ranging from \$600-\$1,200.

Richard and Lucy Quinn Memorial Scholarship— an award of \$1,000-\$1,250 to a student who is a single mother with dependent children or to a student who is the first generation in their family to attend college. The recipient must be a resident of Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, or Leelanau County and be employed at least part time.

Nick J. Rajkovich Memorial Scholarship— awards of \$500 for students in any academic program who attend NMC full-time. Financial need will be considered for equally qualified candidates.

The Reffitt Family Scholarship— an award of a varying amount to a full-time student residing in Antrim County. Recipient must also demonstrate financial need.

Evelyn Rogers Moynihan Scholarship— a \$250 to \$500 award for a female student, in any area of study, residing in the NMC 5 county service area. A 3.0 grade point average is required *only* to renew the scholarship funding for a second semester.

George and Helen Schafer Memorial Scholarship— a \$1,200 award to a student who has graduated from Bear Lake High School. The recipient must have a minimum 2.5 grade point average. Additional information can be obtained from the Bear Lake High School.

Service Learning Scholarship— one or more awards for students enrolled in a 290 level service learning (internship) course at NMC. The scholarship will fund the tuition for one service-learning course for each recipient with a minimum 2.0 grade point average.

Jessie and Oscar Siler Scholarship— an award of approximately \$1,000 to a Native American student who has a minimum 2.0 grade point average.

"Spirit of Alden" Scholarship— Antrim County residents in any academic program are eligible for this \$1,000 award. The recipient must also qualify for financial aid, be enrolled for 6 or more credit hours, and have a minimum grade point average of 2.5.

Margaret A. Stace Memorial Scholarship— an award of at least \$500 to a female resident of Grand Traverse County who is enrolled for six or more credit hours.

State Savings Bank of Frankfort Scholarship— A graduating senior from Frankfort Elberta Area Schools will be selected each spring for this award of \$500. Recipients must be enrolled for 6 or more credits at NMC and have a 2.25 grade point average in high school. Contact the counseling office at the high school for more information.

Stehouwer Family Scholarship— this \$1,000 scholarship will be given to full-time or part-time student with a 3.0 grade point average and demonstrated financial need.

Genevieve Steiger Richardson and Harold Richardson Scholarship— an award of approximately \$700 to a graduate of Traverse City Central High School or Traverse City West High School with demonstrated aptitude.

STRIVE Scholarship/Rotary Club of Traverse City— awards to Traverse City Central High School, Traverse City West High School and St. Francis High School students who in their senior year have shown significant improvement in their grade point averages. The awards are restricted to tuition, fees, required books and supplies. Recipients are chosen by their high school principals. Contact the Rotary Club of Traverse City for information.

Thompson Carless Scholarship— a minimum of \$500 will be awarded to a full or part-time student in any field of study with a 3.0 grade point average or above and demonstrated financial need.

Upward Bound Outstanding Student Scholarship— preference will be given to Upward Bound Program graduates attending NMC within 2 years of high school graduation. Selection will be made each spring by Upward Bound staff based upon academic success, financial need and participation in the program. A \$1,000 scholarship.

C. E. Voltz Memorial Scholarship— a \$500 award to a resident of Benzie County with at least a 2.5 grade point average. Recipients may be full- or part-time and must demonstrate financial need.

Votruba Family Scholarship— numerous awards of \$1,800 to students in any academic program.

Nellie A. Walker Memorial Scholarship— a varying award for a female student with at least a 2.0 grade point average who is in the first generation in her family to attend college.

Walton Junction Sportsman Club Scholarship— Graduates of Forest Area, Manton and Kinglsey high schools are eligible for this \$500 scholarship. Recipients must demonstrate financial need, be registered for 6 or more credits and have a 2.5 grade point average.

The Imogene and Harold Wise Memorial Scholarships— three awards of \$1,200 to students in any academic program.



Norah B. Wright Memorial Scholarship— awards of varying amounts for full- or part-time students in the Associate Degree in Nursing program or an Associate in Science and Arts. Recipients must be residents of the NMC service area.

Ralph E. and Eva B. Wynkoop Scholarship Fund— Several \$1,000 awards to students from Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Leelanau, or Kalkaska Counties who have been out of high school at least two years. Recipients must be enrolled for at least six credit hours. First-year student must have a minimum 2.0 grade point average, and second-year students must have a minimum 2.5 grade point average.

Mary E. Young Memorial Scholarship— Preference for this \$500 award will be given to a nontraditional female student demonstrating financial need who also lives in the NMC 6-county service area. Funds may be used for tuition, fees books, required materials and childcare expenses.

Zonta Opportunity for Change Scholarship— various scholarships awarded to students selected by a scholarship committee from the Women's Resource Center and Zonta Club of Traverse City. Contact the Women's Resource Center for more information.

Scholarships by Academic Area

Art

Daniel R. Olson Memorial Art Scholarship— an award for one semester of tuition and fees for one pottery course. Recipients will be required to exhibit their work. Consideration is based on recommendation by an NMC or high school art instructor. Details are available from the Humanities academic area office.

Patricia Prout Scholarship— this merit-based scholarship award of up to \$1,000 will be given to a second year student with a commitment to study or work in the field of photo journalism or other artistic media. Selection will be by faculty in the Humanities academic area.

Paul Welch Art Department Scholarship— Fine Arts majors with demonstrated financial need will be eligible for this \$500 scholarship award. An NMC faculty committee will make the selection annually from students submitting a portfolio for review.

Aviation

Aviation scholarships are usually awarded by a scholarship committee in the Aviation Program. Contact the department for applications and more information.

Aviation Student Council Scholarship— One \$500 award to a full-time aviation student. A 300-word essay, letter of recommendation and personal resume are required.

CESSNA Foundation Scholarship— Four \$1,000 scholarships awarded annually to the first four students who obtain private licenses.

Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) Chapter 234 Scholarship— an annual award of \$500 given to a full- or part-time aviation student. Applicants may be in their first or second year of studies.

Matthew Brian Feko Memorial Aviation Scholarship— One award of varying amount given to an aviation student with at least a 2.75 grade point average who is taking six or more credits. This scholarship will be given to career-oriented students who demonstrate a passion for flying. Preference will be given to those pursuing a four-year degree through the Davenport/University Center partnership. Applicants cannot have any records related to drinking and driving.

Darrell Keith Holtsclaw Memorial Scholarship— a \$2,500 award for a second-year aviation student with a minimum 3.0 grade point average who is planning to become a career pilot. The award is for flight fees only.

Stanley Mick Memorial Aviation Scholarship— criteria to be determined.

Donovan P. Rodriguez Aviation Scholarship— one \$1,000 merit-based award for a student in Aviation Pilot Training who is a resident of Grand Traverse or the service area and who has a 3.0 grade point average and is enrolled full-time.

Stewart R. Stetson Aviation Scholarship— a \$750 award for an Aviation student who is enrolled for 6 or more credit hours and has at least a 3.0 grade point average. Demonstration of financial need is required, and preference will be given to those working while attending NMC.

Business

Glen A. Anderson Scholarship— a \$2,000 award to a student from the service area with a minimum 3.25 grade point average who is enrolled in the Accounting program. Details are available from the Business academic area office.

Biederman Memorial Scholarship— \$1,000 scholarships awarded from a grant from the Les and Anne Biederman Foundation to students in Maritime, Nursing and Business. Students must have a 2.0 minimum grade point average and be full- or part-time. Preference will be given to those verifying they are participating in clinical nursing or shipboard experiences.

H. Cox & Son Inc. Scholarship— a scholarship of varying amount made to full- or part-time business students residing in the NMC service area. Applicants must demonstrate financial need and have at least a 3.25 grade point average.

Ernest & Donna Rae Gaunt Scholarship— A merit-awarded scholarship of variable amount for a business student taking a minimum of one course who has a 2.5 grade point average.

Independent Accountants Association of Michigan Scholarship— preference for this scholarship will be given to those seeking a career in accounting who are IAAM members or employees of IAAM members. Additional requirements: part-time enrollment status and a 2.5 grade point average. Contact the IAAM for applications.

Keith MacPhee Memorial Scholarship— a \$500 award for a student in any business program who is enrolled at least half time. Recipients must have a minimum 3.0 grade point average.

William C. Martino & Delrose Marlene Martino Scholarship Fund— awards of varying amounts for students in a Business Administration program who are Michigan residents.

Angela Nolf Scholarship— an award of \$500 or more will be given to a second-year student in the Business Program who lives in the NMC six-county service area. Those eligible must complete an application offered through the Business academic area, have a 3.0 grade point average and demonstrate financial need.

Paron Financial Company Scholarship— criteria to be determined.

Glen P. and Anne Robinson Scholarship— a \$1,000 award to a Grand Traverse County resident enrolled in either a Business or Technical program.

Art and Mary Schmuckal Endowment— numerous awards of up to \$1,000 for part-time students and up to \$2,500 for full-time students in Business Administration (Accounting, General Administration, Management, Marketing, or Computer Applications). Recipients must be enrolled at least half time and have a minimum 3.0 grade point average. Financial need will be considered if applicants are equally qualified.

Schmuckal Oil Scholarship— One \$500 scholarship available to a business student demonstrating financial need from Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Leelanau, Wexford, Ottawa, Roscommon, Osceola or Missaukee county. Recipient must be enrolled part-time and have a grade point average of 2.5.

Carrie E. Smith Schuyler Scholarships— one award of variable amount to a female student in a Business program.

Maureen Wolin Memorial Scholarship— a \$250 to \$500 award for a female student with a 3.0 grade point average who is enrolled in a Business academic area program.

Ann P. Zipsper CPA Accounting Scholarship— \$500 is awarded to a female part-time accounting student who demonstrates financial need and lives in the 6-county service area. A minimum grade point average of 3.0 is required.

Communications

Erich Blough Scholarship— One scholarship awarded to a journalism, information technology or psychology student who is taking at least three credits. A minimum grade point average of 2.0 is required.

Jaquish Journalism Scholarship— the recipient of this \$500 scholarship will be an NMC student on the staff of the student newspaper who has a minimum grade point average of 2.0. Newspaper advisors will select the recipient each fall.

Laura Olmstead Memorial Scholarship— modern language majors with a 3.0 grade point average and part-time enrollment status are eligible for this scholarship award of variable amount.



Joseph (Joe) Noverr Scholarship—Awards of varying amounts for residents of Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, Leelanau, or Wexford counties who are pursuing a career in journalism. If qualified journalism students are not identified, secondary preference will be for students in the English program or Communications/Speech. Details are available in the Communications academic area office.

Harry Oliver Theater Scholarship—Recipient must be enrolled in or have completed one or more NMC theater courses and be an active participant in NMC theater productions. Selection will be by a committee of Communications discipline faculty annually. Eligible students must be registered for 1 or more credits and have a minimum grade point average of 2.5.

Culinary Arts

Scholarships are awarded by the Great Lakes Culinary Institute. Contact GLCI for more information and applications.

Angela Kay Ames Scholarship—One \$1,000 award to a culinary student enrolled in a minimum of six credits with a 3.0 minimum GPA. Financial need will be considered. Preference will be given to an adult returning student.

Adam W. Boyd Culinary Arts Scholarship—this \$1,000 scholarship is awarded through the Great Lakes Culinary Institute to a second-year student who has most improved over the prior year of study in the GLCI program at NMC. A grade point average of 2.5 is required.

Chef Pierre Scholarship—awards of up to \$1,500 for students in the Culinary Arts program who have at least a 3.0 grade point average in their major. If applicants are equally qualified, financial need will determine recipients.

Duchene Foundation Culinary Scholarship—the recipient of this \$2,000 scholarship will be selected via application through the Great Lakes Culinary Institute from those with a 3.0 grade point average who qualify for financial aid. Full-time and part-time students are eligible.

Hansen Foods Culinary Scholarship—\$1,000 awarded each year to a culinary student who has demonstrated culinary skill and personal drive, and has a minimum 2.5 grade point average. Full or part-time students are eligible. Preference is given to applicants from Leelanau County if they meet all eligibility requirements.

Lobdell Teaching Restaurant Scholarship—these two \$2,500 scholarships are open to all high school seniors in Antrim, Benzie, Kalkaska, Leelanau, or Grand Traverse counties, (including students graduating from the TBA Career Tech Center Culinary Program) who will be attending NMC's Great Lakes Culinary Institute the following fall. Completion of an application and an interview with a scholarship selection committee are required to select the most qualified recipients. This scholarship may be renewed for a second year of study at GLCI with satisfactory academic progress.

Magnum Hospitality "Missy" Memorial Scholarship—a \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a student in NMC's Great Lakes Culinary Institute who best exemplifies the spirit of hospitality. Additional requirements: a 2.75 grade point average, part-time enrollment status, and residency in the NMC six-county service area, Petoskey, Harbor Springs or Boyne City. Selection will be by GLCI faculty from those who complete the required application.

Northpointe Food Ventures "For the Love of Food" Award—One \$1,000 award for a culinary student from Grand Traverse County enrolled in a minimum of six credits with a minimum 3.0 GPA. Financial need will be considered.

Bob Round Memorial Scholarship—a scholarship of \$500 for a Great Lakes Culinary Institute student with a minimum grade point average of 2.0 who is enrolled for 6 or more credit hours. Financial need will be considered for equally qualified candidates.

Rudd Culinary Scholarship—An award of variable amount to a full-time student of the Great Lakes Culinary Institute with a 2.0 grade point average. Residency within the NMC local and service area counties is required.

Taste of Cherries/National Cherry Festival Scholarship—varying awards to students enrolled in the Great Lakes Culinary Institute. Recipients are chosen based on grade point average, "hospitality persona," and financial need.

Tapawingo Scholarship—awarded to a full-time culinary arts student with a 3.0 grade point average. For consideration, applicants must submit an essay about why they are pursuing a culinary arts career.

Tasters Guild Scholarship—awards of varying amounts to students enrolled in the Great Lakes Culinary Institute with a minimum 3.0 grade point average in their major. Recipients must participate in the Tasters Guild Auction to be eligible.

Dental

Robert and Betty Chase Dental Assistant Scholarship—up to \$1,500 for residents of Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, Leelanau or Wexford Counties who are enrolled in the Dental Assistant program. Additional information can be obtained from the Dental Assistant program coordinator.

Resort District Dental Scholarship—several awards ranging from \$400-\$800 for students in the Dental Assistant Program who are residents of Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Leelanau, Kalkaska, Missaukee, or Wexford County and are enrolled for at least six credit hours. At least one scholarship will be awarded for a second-year student. In the event applicants are equally qualified, patients of Resort District Dental Society members will be given preference. Application information can be obtained from the Dental Assistant program coordinator.

Rhea Swan Scholarship—a \$500 award to a full or part-time student in the Dental Assistant program who displays excellent communication skills. Application information can be obtained from the Dental Assistant program coordinator.

Amy Karczewski Memorial Scholarship Fund for Elementary Education—two \$200 scholarships for full-time students with a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average who reside in the service area and are in the Elementary Education program.

Maise L. Nugent Memorial Scholarship—one \$500 award for a student enrolled in education who has at least a 2.5 grade point average and demonstrates financial need. Recipient must be a Benzie County resident.

D. Jerome & Margery C. Slack Educational Scholarship—various awards to graduating seniors from the Mesick, Buckley, Thompsonville, or Copemish areas who are interested in special education and working with students with ADD, ADHD, or dyslexia. Donald M. Tompkins Computer Scholarship— awards of various amounts to senior citizens (age 55 or older) for computer classes through NMC Extended Educational Services who demonstrate financial need.

Health Occupations

Great Northern Benefits Scholarship— \$500 will be awarded to a full- or part-time health occupations student from the local service area with at least a 2.5 grade point average.

Exchange Club of Traverse City Scholarships— four \$360 scholarships awarded to second-year students from the service area who have a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average. One scholarship each to vocational/technical, allied health, liberal arts and Great Lakes Maritime Academy students.

Stephen and Peg Siciliano History Scholarship— two \$500 awards for second year students in the History program who are enrolled for at least six credit hours and have an overall 3.25 grade point average and a minimum 3.25 grade point average in at least eight credit hours of NMC history course work. Financial need will be considered when there are equally qualified candidates. The amount of the scholarship will vary each year.

The Entering Class of 1951 Scholarship— a \$500 award made to a full time student in this curriculum with a minimum grade point average of 3.0. Recipients must reside in the local service area.

Exchange Club of Traverse City Scholarship— four \$360 scholarships awarded to second-year students from the service area who have a minimum 2.0 grade point average. One scholarship each is awarded to vocational/technical, allied health, liberal arts, and Great Lakes Maritime Academy students.

Jane M. and Chester R. Jones Scholarship Fund— a \$2,000 award to a full-time first-year student in a liberal arts transfer program who lives on campus and has at least a 3.5 high school grade point average. This scholarship may be renewable. A \$2,000 award is also available for a full-time second-year student in a liberal arts transfer program who lives on campus and has at least a 3.0 grade point average.

Jane and John Norton Scholarship— awards to residents of Grand Traverse County in a liberal arts transfer program or a pre-professional program who are enrolled for a minimum of nine credit hours. The scholarship may be renewed for a second year if student maintains a 3.25 grade point average.

Maritime

Scholarships for the Great Lakes Maritime Academy are awarded by the Maritime Scholarship Committee. Additional information and details for applying for these awards may be obtained from the Maritime office.

Henry Allingham Maritime Scholarship— Two \$500 awards to Great Lakes Maritime Academy students with a minimum GPA of 3.0. Students must be enrolled full-time or participating in the at-sea semester. Financial need will be considered. Preference to students from the United Kingdom.

Biederman Memorial Scholarship— \$1,000 scholarships awarded from a grant from the Les and Anne Biederman Foundation to students in Maritime, Nursing and Business. Recipients must have at least a 2.0 grade point average and be full- or part-time. Preference will be given to those verifying they are participating in clinical or shipboard experiences.

George S. Biros, Jr. Maritime Academy Scholarship— an award of \$500 for a Maritime Academy student with a 3.0 grade point average who demonstrates financial need.

Chris and April Branson Maritime Scholarship— one \$500 award made to support Maritime students with at least a 2.0 grade point average. Applicants have to be second-year, returning students taking twelve or more credits. Demonstration of financial need is required.

Arthur W. Brophy Memorial Scholarship— awards of various amounts open to students in the Maritime program who are enrolled full time.

Grand Traverse Bay Power Squadron Maritime Scholarship— second, third and fourth year cadets in NMC's Maritime program with full-time cadet status (5 or more credits) and a minimum 2.5 grade point average are eligible to apply for this \$500 minimum award. Eligible cadets must have successfully completed the first sea project experience.

Great Lakes Maritime Academy Superintendent's Scholarship— varying awards to first-year cadets demonstrating financial need and having supporting outside recommendations. A short essay is required.

Great Lakes Maritime Task Force Scholarship— a \$500 award to a U.S. citizen who demonstrates excellence in communicating the importance of cabotage laws to legislators and have a minimum 3.0 grade point average. Financial need will be considered if there are equally qualified applicants.

Great Lakes Passenger Boat Association Scholarship— Preference for this \$500 award will go to a Maritime student whose family owns or is employed in the passenger boating business; second preference will be given to a fourth year Maritime student demonstrating financial need. Recipients may be taking any number of credit hours and there is no residency requirement.

Maxine V. Hurley Memorial Scholarship— an award of varying amounts for a full-time cadet with at least a 2.0 grade point average who is in the third year of the Engine Officer program. This award is for the fall semester. Financial need is considered if there are equally qualified applicants.

Christian P. Kamm Scholarship— several \$1,000 scholarships for second-year Deck Program cadets who have at least a 3.3 grade point average.

Gordon Lightfoot Maritime Scholarship— several awards of up to \$2,000 to cadets with a minimum 3.2 grade point average. Selections are based on academic standing and overall performance as a cadet. A short essay is required.

Captain Lewis Ludington Scholarship— awards of approximately \$1,000 to second-year cadets who have a minimum 2.5 grade point average and have displayed exemplary traits of leadership, cooperation with classmates, professional excellence, and participation in Academy sponsored projects. Financial need will be considered for equally qualified applicants.

Marine Engineers Beneficial Association GLMA Scholarship— second, third and fourth year cadets in NMC's Maritime program are eligible for several scholarships of \$1,000 or more. A 3.0 grade point average, demonstration of financial need, and a completed application are also required.

Maritime Heritage Alliance Scholarship— scholarship support will be provided to a future GLMA cadet who is a band member of the Menominee Tribe in Wisconsin.



NMC

Student Services

George W. Raymond Memorial Maritime Scholarship—Maritime Engine cadets may apply for this scholarship of \$500 or more through the GLMA program. Those with State of Michigan residency status, a 2.75 grade point average, and demonstrated financial need are eligible.

Franklin Sears Memorial Maritime Scholarship Fund—several awards for full-time cadets with a minimum 2.0 grade point average. Awards are made on the basis of academic achievement, participation in Academy activities, and demonstrated financial need.

Captain Ray Skelton Memorial Maritime Scholarship—This award was established in 2006 as a memorial to Captain Ray Skelton. An award of varying amounts for a Senior Deck Cadet with a minimum GPA of 2.0 (GPA of 3.0 in navigation, seamanship and shiphandling courses recommended but not required). Preference is given to cadet with commercial maritime experience over an individual with higher grades. Not need based.

Barbara Thompson Maritime Scholarship—GLMA cadets are invited to apply for scholarships of varying amounts through the Maritime Program. Those enrolled for 6 or more credit hours are eligible and financial need will be considered for those equally qualified.

Admiral Paul E. Trimble Maritime Endowment Scholarship—varying awards for second, third, or fourth year cadets.

Mathematics

Corinne J. Naar Mathematics Scholarship—two \$750 awards to students majoring in Mathematics. Recipients are selected by Mathematics faculty.

Gordon & Marlene Rady Scholarship—varying awards to second-year students from the service area who are in the Math, Science or Nursing programs.

Music

Walt and Pat Ross Music Scholarship—this award of varying amount will be given to a full-time music student with a 3.0 grade point average or higher.

Carrie E. Smith Schuyler Scholarship—one award of varying amount to a female student in the Music program.

Kaye Spearing Memorial Scholarship—one \$500 award for a student enrolled at least half-time in the Music or Education programs. Recipient must be from the service area with preference given to Suttons Bay students. Financial need will be considered if applicants are equally qualified.

Patricia and Gene Wolff Memorial Scholarship—an award of approximately \$900 to a music major with an interest in jazz preferred. Recipients may be full- or part-time students with a 3.0 grade point average. Recipients are selected by music faculty. Details are available from the Humanities academic area office.

Biederman Memorial Scholarship—\$1,000 scholarships awarded from a grant from the Les and Anne Biederman Foundation to students in Maritime, Nursing and Business. Recipients must have at least a 2.0 grade point average and be full- or part-time. Preference will be given to those verifying they are participating in clinical or ship-board experiences.

Kathleen (Kay) Donnelly Scholarship—a \$500 award to an Associate Degree Nursing student.

Alice Drulard Memorial Nursing Scholarship—a \$500 award given to a nursing student requesting financial assistance who has a 2.5 grade point average and Michigan residency. Nursing faculty will recommend recipients.

Earl J. and Theresa Lee Hathaway Memorial Scholarship—varying awards up to \$2,000 made to students enrolled in the Pre-Nursing, PN or ADN program who have a 2.5 cumulative grade point average and are enrolled at least half-time.

Olive Longcore Memorial Scholarship—\$500 is awarded to a full- or part-time nursing student residing in the NMC service area.

The Marriott Scholarship Fund—an award of varying amounts to a student in the Associate Degree Nursing or Practical Nursing program with preference given to a resident of Antrim County.

Rita J. Mills Memorial Scholarship—one \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a nursing student registered for 6 or more credits with a 2.0 grade point average. Recipient must also demonstrate financial need.

Hettie Molvang Nursing Scholarship—varying awards for second-year Associate Degree in Nursing students from Grand Traverse or Wexford County who have at least a 2.5 grade point average. The scholarship is limited to tuition and fees.

Harold C. "Curly" and Ida Murner Nursing Scholarship—several awards of \$500-\$1,500 for students from Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, or Leelanau County enrolled in the Associate Degree in Nursing or Practical Nursing program.

Ward L. Oliver Memorial Scholarship—NMC students registered as nursing or pre-medical majors are eligible for this \$500 scholarship. A 3.0 grade point average and part-time enrollment status are required.

Peggy A. Pronger Nursing Scholarship—variable award given annually to a student enrolled in the undergraduate nursing program, who demonstrates financial need and has maintained a 3.0 grade point average.

Gordon & Marlene Rady Scholarship—varying awards to second-year students from the service area who are in a Math, Science or Nursing program.

Fred M. & Carmen B. Rothermel Scholarship—Two \$1,200 awards to full-time nursing students with a GPA of 3.0 or better. Financial need will be considered. The scholarship is renewable for a second year.

Swift Nursing Endowment Fund—a scholarship of varying amount for those pursuing the ADN or practical nursing track at NMC. Those enrolled for 6 or more credit hours with established residency in the 6-county NMC service area who qualify for financial aid are eligible.

Mabel Tompkins Nursing Scholarship—a \$500 award to a resident of Grand Traverse County who is in the Associate Degree Nursing or Practical Nursing program.

Traverse City Woman's Club Endowment Scholarship—one to two awards of varying amounts to students in the Associate Degree in Nursing, Practical Nursing, or Education programs. Recipients must be residents of Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Leelanau, or Kalkaska County and be enrolled at least six credit hours.

Marion Weigand Memorial Scholarship—awards of various amounts open to students enrolled full or part-time in the Nursing program who are residents of the NMC service area and demonstrate financial need.

Performing Arts

NMC Performing Arts Program Scholarship—One award equivalent to four contact hours to any dance student with a 4.0 GPA in dance classes.

Pre-Professional (Law, Social Work, Medical, Psychology, Sociology)

Bearup and Judson Legal Scholarship—a \$500 merit-based scholarship given to pre-law or legal assistant students who are pursuing a career in the legal field. Other requirements: a 3.5 grade point average, residency in the NMC service area and enrollment for six credits or more credits.

Ferguson-Osterlin Health Scholarship—three to five awards of \$1,000 to \$1,500 for students in health care related programs. Recipients must be residents of Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, Leelanau or Wexford counties and be enrolled for a minimum of six credit hours.

Ruth and Clifford Foster Scholarship—an award of varying amounts for a resident of Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, or Leelanau County enrolled in any program in the Health Occupations Disciplines or in the Pre-Medical program.

Douglas and Arlene Frantz Scholarship—Students from Benzie, Grand Traverse or Leelanau counties who are registered as Biology or Pre-med majors are eligible for this \$500 award. Recipients must also be enrolled part-time and have a grade point average of 3.0.

Ward L. Oliver Memorial Scholarship—NMC students registered as nursing or pre-medical majors are eligible for this \$500 scholarship. A 3.0 grade point average and part-time enrollment status are required.

Jane and John Norton Scholarship—an award to a resident of Grand Traverse County in a liberal arts transfer program or a pre-profession program who is enrolled for a minimum of nine credit hours. The scholarship may be renewed for a second year if the student maintains at least a 3.25 grade point average.

Catherine Strom Schmidt Zonta II Scholarship—an award of variable amount to a female resident of Grand Traverse or Leelanau County enrolled in the pre-professional program or Social Science academic area. A 3.0 grade point average is required.

Marion Weigand Memorial Scholarship—an award of varying amount to a student in the Nursing program who demonstrates financial need and is a resident of the six-county NMC service area.



Science

W.R. Angell Biology Scholarship— a number of awards of \$1,000 per semester to students who have demonstrated both ability and interest in majoring in some area of the natural sciences. Selection criteria include a minimum 3.0 high school or college grade point average during the last two years of high school and recommendations from high school or college science teaching staff. Academic standing is reviewed each semester. Applications are invited from entering first year students as well as current NMC students. More information and application forms are available through the Science/Math academic area.

Douglas and Arlene Frantz Scholarship— Students from Benzie, Grand Traverse or Leelanau counties who are registered as Biology or Pre-med majors are eligible for this \$500 award. Recipients must also be enrolled part-time and have a grade point average of 3.0.

Gordon & Marlene Rady Scholarship— varying awards to second-year students from the service area who are in Math, Science or Nursing programs.

Ann Rogers Family Scholarship for Environmental Studies— An award of variable amount will be given to a student pursuing environmental studies or who is involved in environmental activities. Residents of NMC local and service area counties who have a 3.0 grade point average will be considered.

Joseph H. Rogers Science-Mathematics Honor Award— A \$500 merit award for the student with the highest GPA considering coursework taken. Selection is through Math-Science Department each spring.

Bob and Grace Rudd Physical Science and Engineering Scholarship— a varying award to a student from the service area with at least a 2.5 grade point average who is in the Physical Science or Engineering program.

Peta Williams Memorial Scholarship— an award of varying amount given to a Biology or Environmental Studies major. Selection criteria include a minimum 3.0 high school or college grade point average during the last two years of high school and recommendations from high school or college science teaching staff. Academic standing is reviewed each semester. Applications are invited from entering first year students as well as current NMC students. More information and application forms are available through the Science/Math academic area. The award is restricted to tuition, fees, and books.

Social Science

Wilmeth Social Science Scholarship— those pursuing a major within the Social Science academic area are eligible for this \$500 scholarship. Additional requirements: demonstration of financial need, a 3.0 grade point average, and enrollment for 6 or more credit hours.

Technical

Dale Anderson Memorial Scholarship— an award of varying amount made to support students in the technical discipline with a 2.0 grade point average or higher. Demonstration of financial need is required as well as U.S. citizenship. In addition, applicants must be enrolled for six or more credit hours.

Otto and Kathy Belovich Automotive Scholarship— \$500 awarded to a student from the NMC service area with a 2.5 minimum grade point average. Recipients have to be committed to careers in the automotive business. Preference will be given to applicants currently employed at Cherry Capital or Traverse Motors.

Erich Blough Scholarship— One scholarship awarded to a journalism, information technology or psychology student who is taking at least three credits. A minimum grade point average of 2.0 is required.

Gary L. Clark Machine Tool Scholarship— Preference will be given to those enrolled in NMC's machine tool program; secondary preference will be given to students in the manufacturing technology program. There is no grade point requirement, but recipients must demonstrate financial need and be enrolled part-time at NMC.

Wayne G. Cowell Memorial Scholarship— an award of varying amount to a student in any Technical program who resides within the six-county service area and has at least a 3.0 grade point average. Financial need is considered if applicants are equally qualified.

Exchange Club of Traverse City Scholarship— four \$360 scholarships awarded to second-year students from the service area who have a minimum 2.0 grade point average. One scholarship each is awarded to vocational/technical, allied health, liberal arts and Great Lakes Maritime Academy students.

William Kiker Memorial Scholarship— a \$250 award for a student in the Electronics program with a 2.0 grade point average who demonstrates financial need.

Glen P. and Anne Robinson Scholarship— a \$1,000 award to a Grand Traverse County resident enrolled in either a Business or Technical program.

RM Young Company Technical Scholarship— preference will be given to a successful NMC student pursuing Manufacturing Technology, other technical track, or Engineering. Part-time enrollment status, a 3.0 grade point average, and residency in the six-county NMC service area are also required. Financial need will be considered for equally qualified candidates.

Frank and Dorothy Stulen Technical Scholar Award— A variable number of awards will be given to support students in technical studies. Funds may be used for tuition, fees, books, required professional tools/materials, or for attendance at student professional development meetings.

Technical Careers Scholarships— awards of varying amounts for full-time and part-time students in any technical program. Eligible recipients must complete an application, have a 3.0 grade point average in tech coursework, and be a resident of the NMC 6-county service area. Contact the Technical academic area for more information.

Grand Traverse Regional Community Foundation Scholarships— Several awards are available to students enrolled in courses at the NMC University Center.

NMC Student Government Association Scholarship— An award of \$500 to a student with a 3.0 grade point average in UC classes who is officially admitted to a bachelor's degree program and is a resident of Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska or Leelanau county. Financial need will be considered.

NMC and UC Dual Enrollment Scholarship— An award of variable amount for a student taking at least three credits at NMC who is also admitted to a bachelor's degree program at UC. Demonstration of financial need and a grade point average of 3.0 are required.

Visual Communications

Don Agosa Scholarship— an award of approximately \$750 for a Native American student with a minimum 2.0 grade point average who is a resident of Michigan and is in the Visual Communications (Commercial Art) program.

TCottage.com Visual Communications Scholarship— preference for this \$500 scholarship will be given to those taking interactive media classes at NMC. Eligible students must be taking 6 or more credit hours and have a grade point average of 3.0. Selection will be by Visual Communications faculty based on portfolio review and academic performance.

Knorr Marketing Scholarship— applicants for this \$500 scholarship must have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher, be Visual Communications majors and be taking at least six credits. This award also entitles the recipient to an internship opportunity for 40 hours at Knorr Marketing in the academic year of award.

Additional Scholarships

Comfort Keepers Caregiver Scholarship— Two \$500 awards to students enrolled in any program of study. Financial need will be considered. Preference will be given first to employees of Comfort Keepers and to single parent students second.

Elva Travino Hart Diversity Scholarship— Two to four \$500 to \$1,000 awards made to students in any program of study enrolled in a minimum of six credits with a GPA of 2.5 or better.

Additional private donor scholarships are made available to NMC students by Grand Traverse area organizations which govern the rules and regulations for the awards. Applications are made directly to the organization.
